



“Make a World of Difference” Art Contests:

Sponsored by: Spartanburg Earth Day Festival

Theme: “Make a World of Difference” is the theme for this art contest.

Participation

Two separate contests are being offered: for high school and college students. High school artists may be in 9th - 12th grades, including home schoolers. College students must be currently enrolled in a public or private college. Multiple entries are permitted, but each submission must be registered separately. There is no charge to participate in this contest.

Eligible submissions

All submissions should exemplify the theme of “Make a World of Difference.” Accepted mediums include Drawing, Painting, and Digital Art. All images submitted must be owned and created by the artist.

Each submission must contain the following:

- One image of the artwork, 300 dpi suitable for enlargement up to height: 42" - 48" & width: 36" to 42" (about 11 MB) in jpeg format
- A maximum 500 characters description of the artwork, in a textual file in English
- A completed registration form
- A short biography of the artist

Prizes:

The creator of the **winning high school and college entry** will be notified by April 1, 2018. The first place high school entry will receive \$200 at the festival awards ceremony. The first place college entry will receive \$400 at the festival awards ceremony. The artwork will be used to promote the Spartanburg Earth Day Festival. Spartanburg Earth Day Festival will retain exclusive SC rights to the image for three years, and usage rights for five years. First and second place college entries will be offered a joint free booth at the Spartanburg Earth Day Festival on April 21, 2018 to exhibit family friendly artwork.
